Kinectrics is dedicated to conducting business in a lawful manner with the highest standards of business ethics. We require our suppliers to conduct business to the same high standards.

Kinectrics opposes all forms of slavery and human trafficking and is committed to ensuring modern slavery or trafficking does not exist in our business dealings.


Kinectrics is committed to operating with corporate social responsibility - ethics and integrity, diversity and inclusion, gender equality, Indigenous inclusion, anti-bribery and anti-corruption, human rights, anti-modern slavery, and prevention of family violence. The health, safety and wellbeing of our people, our clients, and their families, is always a priority.

Due to Kinectrics being acquired by BWX Technologies (BWXT) in May 2025, Kinectrics previous financial year is April 1, 2025, to December 31, 2025. The following constitutes Kinectrics' modern slavery statement in accordance with Bill S-211 for financial year 2025.

## 1.0 Who we are

Kinectrics is a wholly owned subsidiary of BWX Technologies, Inc. (BWXT) and operates as part of the BWXT group of companies. Kinectrics operates as a separate and independent organisation within BWXT and Kinectrics itself contains several wholly owned subsidiaries.

All Kinectrics business is performed under the governance and direction of our executive leadership team working in tandem with the BWXT management team. Kinectrics authorities are delegated by means of the Kinectrics Organizational Authorities Register and identifies the President as the central authority for day-to-day operations.

Reporting to the President is the executive leadership team who are collectively responsible for the strategic direction, growth, and operations of Kinectrics' businesses that aligns with our corporate values.

Under the supervision of the executive team, Kinectrics work is led by our operations teams who are supported by our central teams. The central teams have responsibility for maintaining centralized requirements and infrastructure, supporting operations in the execution of the work, and designing policies and procedures to protect the company's interests. These policies enforce the company's values in matters including safety, procurement, legal and regulatory compliance, and labour relations including recruitment and retention of an engaged, equitable and diverse workforce.

Our central teams have authority over the activities of our operations teams to ensure Kinectrics meets its obligations for compliance with regulations, codes, and standards.

Further, the Kinectrics Procurement team has the following structure:

- The procurement team reports to the Senior Vice President of Business Improvements & Compliance.
- All purchase requests are centralized and are approved according to our Organizational Authority Register.
- All goods requiring quality assurance controls and any other goods over a threshold are purchased through a purchase order and maintained and tracked in our central financial system.
- Items are procured with stipulated quality requirements. Where required, Kinectrics visits and observes vendors.
- Kinectrics has a multi-tier supply chain.
- Kinectrics' international locations do not deliver goods or materials directly to our Canadian clients.

## 2.0 What we do

Kinectrics develops innovative solutions for the global electricity and medical industries, helping to empower a sustainable future. We have:

- 1,300+ highly technical staff with vast knowledge of the electricity industry.
- 30+ unique laboratories and 400,000 square feet of operating facilities worldwide.

- 70+ life-cycle management services across multiple industries.
- 19 locations, across 7 countries, with the ability to support customers across the world.

We help keep the electric power industry running smoothly and to specification. This is accomplished through our independent laboratory and testing facilities, a diverse fleet of field inspection equipment, and an award-winning team of engineers and technical experts.

Based on our values, Kinectrics has built an unwavering and strong reputation for conducting business with integrity, earning the respect and trust of our clients, employees, and the communities in which we work. This includes committing to the various communities we operate in by contributing through a variety of donations, sponsorships and industry memberships.

Most recently, this includes:

- Recognition in 2025, as a Local Leader by the United Way Greater Toronto where we have raised more than \$2.5M dollars to help local communities in the fight against poverty.
- Partnering with the Yonge Street Mission (YSM) in Toronto, Ontario to generate more employment opportunities for the community through donations. Our employees also volunteer their time to help prepare meals for those in need and participated in a charity walk-a-thon.
- Sizeable donations to help retrofit the Teeswater Medical Centre and to purchase specialized medical equipment for the Wingham Hospital in the Bruce Grey County.

- Donation drives for First Nations groups, as well as underprivileged and marginalized groups.

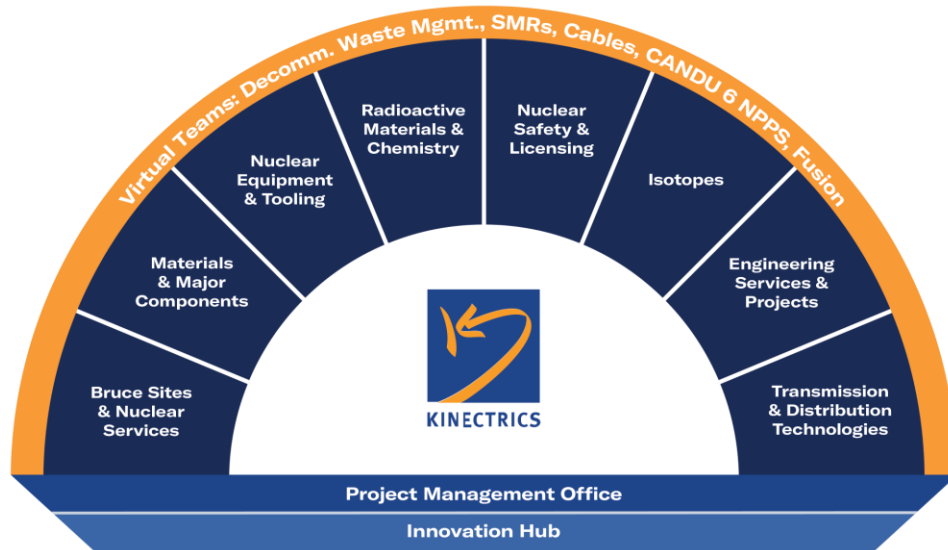

## 2.1 Services

Kinectrics' eight Key Capabilities are supported by a Tier 1 Engineering Base and are supported and influenced by our Project Management Office and Innovation Hub.



- 1. Bruce Sites & Nuclear Services:** Unparalleled support to help clients procure, test and launder Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) products. This group also offers in-situ client support and comprehensive radioactive materials management to ensure complete care and control of substances through their lifecycle.
- 2. Materials & Major Components:** Life Cycle Management Services and methodologies for Nuclear Plant Components with world-renowned expertise and facilities.
- 3. Nuclear Equipment & Tooling:** Innovative tooling solutions, deployment expertise, and turnkey support for equipment needs from design to testing and supply.
- 4. Radioactive Materials & Chemistry:** Comprehensive radioactive materials management ensuring complete care & control of nuclear substances throughout their lifecycle.
- 5. Nuclear Safety & Licensing:** Providing the Nuclear Industry and Small Modular Reactor (SMR) vendors with a Centre of Excellence for Nuclear Safety Analysis & Licensing.
- 6. Isotopes:** Creating a vertically integrated global medical isotope supply chain in Ontario.
- 7. Engineering Services & Projects:** Leading supplier of Nuclear Plant Engineering services covering all disciplines and providing solutions for the lowest cost of ownership globally.

8. **Transmission & Distribution Technologies:** Providing testing and asset management services that translate into reliable condition assessment and predictable life extension of assets for the transmission side of the commercial electricity industry.

## 3.0 Our supply chains

Kinectrics provides both professional services and products for our clients. Based on the nature and type of each, there is a low risk of human rights violations and modern slavery in our operations and supply chains.

With respect to Kinectrics' provision of professional services, our supply chain consists of using professional consultants and contractors.

In terms of Kinectrics' products, our supply chain consists of the procurement of components or supplies to complete our technologies including:

- **Health & Safety:** includes Arc Flash Analysis Software, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), Synthetic Blood for PPE Testing.
- **Nuclear Generation:** includes CANDU nuclear reactor inspection tools for feeder piping, fuel channels, and steam generators.
- **Radioactive Waste Management:** specifically the SCEPTER™ Selective Carbon Extraction Process for removing Carbon-14 from ion exchange resins.
- **Transmission & Distribution:** includes Anagen™, a self-healing dielectric fluid that replaces cable insulation oils, and LineVue® Overhead Conductor Inspection Tools for electricity transmission and distribution lines.

Kinectrics has a strong counterfeit, fraudulent, and suspect item (CFSI) prevention and identification program for safety critical parts to ensure such parts do not enter the supply chain. Further, the majority of the services and products procured by Kinectrics are from Canada.

## 4.0 Ensuring our supply chains are free of forced and child labour

With respect to Kinectrics' provision of professional services, workers are required to provide evidence of their specific job qualifications. All workers are required to read and adhere to our Code of Business conduct. Further, as they are under the direct supervision of Kinectrics line management, their conduct and behaviours are closely monitored.

With respect to Kinectrics' products, there is low potential for modern slavery in our supply chain:

- We work primarily with Canadian companies and do not undertake work at high-risk for potential forced or child labour in foreign countries.
- We have applied additional diligence with national and international vendors by requesting they confirm our expectations.

## 4.1 Our policies

The following Kinectrics governance prohibits child/forced labour/slavery:

- Kinectrics Integrated Management System Manual
- Kinectrics Code of Business Conduct
- Kinectrics Purchasing Policies & Best Practices

We have taken steps to include adherence to human rights principles in the above policies and procedures.

Our employees are expected to abide by our **Code of Business Conduct**, which ensures a culture that fosters transparency, and empowers our people to identify, and respond to ethics-related issues. Code of Business Conduct refresher training is to be done every three years unless there is an update to the Code, in which case the retraining is to be assigned at the time of the Code update.

Kinectrics has a **Confidential, Anonymous Reporting** for Employees (CARE) hotline available to report any matters of concern, including code of conduct or ethics violations.

Our suppliers, contractors, consultants, and business associates working under Kinectrics' direction are expected to have read, understand, and comply with our Code of Business Conduct. Our Code of Business Conduct applies to all people working for us or on our behalf in any capacity, including employees at all levels, as well as seconded workers and contractors.

As part of our contracting processes, we expect our suppliers, in North America and globally (e.g., Europe, China, India, etc.) to hold their own suppliers to the same high standards. We have recently requested confirmation of our suppliers to report back on such conduct with respect to their supply chains and to date, have not received any indications of risks that could potentially involve forced or child labor.

The prevention, detection, and reporting of modern slavery in any part of our business or supply chains is the responsibility of all those working for us or under our control. Employees are required to avoid any activity that might lead to, or even suggest, a breach of this policy.

Employees are to notify, as applicable, their manager and Human Resources if they believe or suspect a conflict with this policy has occurred or may occur. Employees are encouraged to raise concerns about any issue or suspicion of modern slavery in any part of our business, or in supply chains of any supplier at the earliest possible stage.

Kinectrics is committed to supporting the protection of human rights throughout our operations. We will not knowingly do business with suppliers, clients, business partners, or others who do not adhere to our human rights principles.

## 4.2 Our due diligence process

Our standard contracts stipulate that suppliers comply with all applicable laws, rules and regulations

including those related to human trafficking, worker welfare, and modern slavery.

### **4.3 Employee training on forced and child labour**

Corporate Code of Business Conduct training is part of Kinectrics' employee induction process. The content includes Kinectrics commitment to avoiding slavery and the requirement that we will not knowingly do business with suppliers, clients, business partners, or others who do not adhere to our human rights principles. Refresher training is to be completed every three years or less.

### **4.4 How we monitor ourselves & our suppliers**

Kinectrics currently reports on various environmental social and corporate governance items, but not child or forced labour. Kinectrics has previously solicited our vendor community for information on forced labour and continues to solicit it from new vendors. Kinectrics has informed its suppliers regarding their obligations as outlined in Bill S-211 and requested relevant information.

This effort is aimed at improving awareness and transparency across our Supply Chain. Supplied responses are collected to assess the risk of child labour in our supply chain. Kinectrics is actively collaborating with suppliers to monitor and address.

### **4.5 How we are aware of risks of forced or child labour in global supply chains**

Kinectrics is committed to ensuring that forced and child labour are not used in our supply chains. The majority of materials are sourced from Canadian suppliers who comply with local labour laws and regulations.

## **5.0 How we have addressed reported risks or use of forced or child labour in our supply chains**

Kinectrics, to date, has not faced situations of forced or child labour and has therefore not had to remedy such situations.
